PRESS STATEMENT

VACCINATION CAMPAIGN:

As of December 11th 2021, a total of **8,169,739** vaccines had so far been administered across the country. Of these, **4,918,051** were partially vaccinated while those fully vaccinated were **3,251,688**. The uptake of the second dose among those who received their first dose was at **57.3**%. Proportion of adults fully vaccinated was **11.9**%. The Government is working towards vaccinating a targeted population of **27,246,033**.

The table below shows the total County cumulative trends and proportion of fully vaccinated. Nairobi County is in the lead with **30.3%** of the population fully vaccinated followed by Nyeri at **25.3%**, Kiambu **19.2%**, Laikipia **19.0%**, Murang'a **14.7%**, Uasin Gishu at **14.6%**, Taita Taveta **14.5%**, Kirinyaga **13.6%**, Nyandarua and Nakuru **13.1%**, Kajiado and Kisumu at **12.8%** and Mombasa **12.5%**. Meanwhile, West Pokot is among the counties with the least number of population fully vaccinated at **2.9%**, Wajir **2.7%**, and Mandera **2.4%**.

The table below shows the proportion of the above 18 years' population who have received at least one dose of Covid-19 vaccine (A dose of Johnson and Johnson vaccine and first dose of other vaccines) as at Saturday 11th, December 2021. So far, **5,350,439** persons have received at least one dose, out of the target population **27,246,033 (19.6%)**.

On the Covid-19 situation today **201** people have tested positive for the disease, from a sample size of **4,011** tested in the last 24 hours. The positivity rate is now at **5.0%**. From the cases **157** are Kenyans while **44** are foreigners. **118** males and **83** are females. The youngest is an **eight-month-old child** while the oldest is **78** years. Total confirmed positive cases are now **256,335** and cumulative tests so far conducted are **2,889,613**. In terms of **County** distribution; Nairobi **119**, Mombasa **31**, Trans Nzoia **10**, Kiambu **10**, Machakos **9**, Nakuru **6**, Kajiado **4**, Meru **3**, Kisumu **2**, Kwale **2**, Baringo **1**, Bungoma **1**, Kakamega **1**, Kilifi **1** and Nyeri **1**.

Distribution of positive cases by age is as follows; 0-9 years (4), 10-19 years (5), 20-29 years (41), 30-39 (73), 40-49 (41), 50-59 (19), 60 years and above (18).

Today **4** patients have recovered from the disease all of them from the Home-Based Isolation and Care program. Total recoveries now stand at **248,515** of whom **200,536** are from the Home-Based Care and Isolation program, while **47,979** are from various health facilities countrywide.

Unfortunately, **two** patients have succumbed to the disease, all of them being late deaths reported after conducting facility record audit in the month of December 2021. This now pushes the cumulative fatalities to **5,348**. Our sincere condolences to the family and friends of those who have lost their loved ones.

New deaths by age; 0-9 years (0), 10-19 years (0), 20-29 (0), 30-39 years (0), 40-49 years (0), 50-59 years (0), 60 years and above (2).

Cumulative deaths by age; 0-9 years (58), 10-19 years (39), 20-29 (144), 30-39 years (386), 40-49 years (620), 50-59 years (997), 60 years and above (3,104).

A total of **188** patients are currently admitted in various health facilities countrywide, while **834** are under the Home-Based Isolation and Care program. **2** patients are in the Intensive Care Unit (ICU), and all of them are on ventilatory support.

A total of **49** patients are on supplemental oxygen with **48** of them being in the general wards. **One** patient is in the High Dependency Unit (HDU).
